How to Get Around D.C.

There are 91 stations and 6 lines throughout the region. Before riding, purchase a SmarTrip card at any station kiosk (which you can add to your Apple wallet). To ride, tap your card upon entry & exit. Fare prices vary depending on time of day and distance traveled, around \$2-5. Common GPS apps and the DC Metro Route app provide accurate routing directions.



Rideshare Services
Uber/Lyft/Taxi are all available in the region. Prices vary depending on time of day and distance.



Big Bus/ Trolley Tours
Tour all the hot spots in D.C. in a double decker bus with a guide, about \$45-60 per ticket.
