I respectfully request \$4 million in Community Project Funding for the Fairfield Transit and Municipal Fleet Electrification Project in fiscal year 2024. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Fairfield located at 1000 Webster Street, Fairfield, California 94533.

This Community Project Funding would be used to install maintenance and charging infrastructure for the City's transit vehicle fleet and purchase two additional battery-electric vehicles for a new microtransit service providing point-to-point service for areas currently underserved by existing services. This new micro-transit service will also connect to the City's local fixed-route system, regional commuter bus services, and two nearby Amtrak stations: Fairfield-Vacaville Hannigan and Suisun-Fairfield Train Stations.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because the two additional battery-electric vehicles for the on-demand, micro-transit service will better serve David Grant USAF Medical Center at Travis Air Force Base, which is the largest Air Force medical center in the continental United States. This innovative service will also provide more efficient accessibility and connectivity for military families, civilian employees, and disabled veterans who need access to Travis Air Force Base and its medical center. The project has a Federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by chapter 53 of title 49, United States Code.
